### THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN CALGARY

#### Photograph the fall foliage

Algonquin Park is the place to go if you want to capture the breathtaking fall foliage as the leaves turn golden, red and orange. To avoid the crowds, visit during weekdays.

### DID YOU KNOW?

The best time to see the fall foliage at Algonquin Park is from mid-September to mid-October.

Established in 1893, Algonquin Park was the first provincial park in Ontario.

The park has been the inspiration for over 40 books, 1,800 scientific papers, a dozen films, a symphony, and the art of Tom Thomson and the Group of Seven.

The park has had its boundaries changed eight times to incorporate 15 additional parcels of land.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO ON THE CABOT TRAIL

### Watersports

With North River Kayak Tours you can enjoy the stunning autumn colours and discover the hidden coastline of Cape Breton Island. There are sea kayaking tours to suit everyone's needs from beginner to advanced paddlers.

### Hike the Skyline Trail

This dramatic headland cliff offers stunning views over the rugged coast and the Cabot Trail as it winds its way down the mountain. You might spot moose, bald eagles and other birds during the walk.

### Relax on the Ingonish Beach

The Ingonish Beach is unique as you can jump from saltwater at the beach to a freshwater lake in just a few, small steps. Its golden sand, countryside and headlands make it one of the most popular stops along the Cabot Trail.

### Celtic Colours International Festival

The Celtic Colours International Festival is a nine-day festival with over 50 concerts. Cape Breton Island comes alive with music, energy and excitement as people come from all over the world to celebrate the region's culture.



## RESTAURANTS/FOODS TO TRY ON THE CABOT TRAIL

### The Bite House

The Bite House is inspired by the different seasons and it takes pride in the fact that diners can enjoy meals that include ingredients sourced from local farmers.

### Harbour Restaurant & Bar

The Harbour Restaurant & Bar is a family run restaurant that aims to offer you a unique dining experience. It's famed for its seafood and pasta dishes, but you can also enjoy strip loin steak, burgers and other delicious meals.

### The Rusty Anchor Restaurant

Being the halfway point on the Cabot Trail, The Rusty Anchor Restaurant is the perfect place to stop for food or a drink. You can enjoy the best lobster rolls in the area and other great foods like mussels, pasta and burgers.

## DID YOU KNOW?

The Cabot Trail was named after Italian explorer John Cabot (Giovanni Caboto) in 1497. He was sailing on a mission for King Henry VII.

The Celtic Colours International Festival isn't held in one location as communities around Cape Breton Island host concerts and workshops.

The Cabot Trail was completed in 1932 after it joined previously isolated fishing villages.

Approximately 88% of the Cape Breton Highlands National Park is forested.
