THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN BANFF

Skiing at top resorts

Banff has some of the best skiing anywhere in the world. With stunning Mount Norquay, Lake Louise Ski Resort, and Sunshine Village, skiers are spoiled for choice.

Moraine Lake
